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# Title of the frame

## Example

We might discuss some data, that are tricky

We should also ask ourselves how much in height we can put as those notes. Maybe it's only a couple of lines, maybe it's a very loooooong text ... Who knows ? After all, nobody tested this, so we need to do it now. I think it's becoming long enough. An interesting thing to check is what happens when it's too big in height. Points not to forget:

- It should still be readable
- The speaker must not rely only on those notes
- It's not intended to be perfect

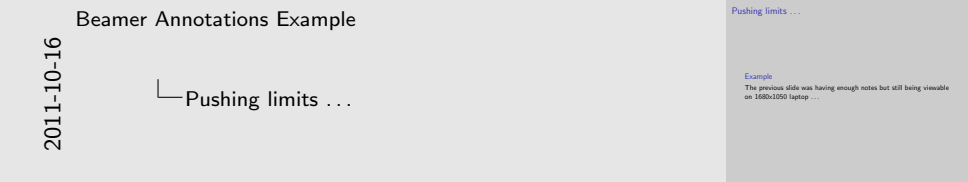
You have to remember that notes are **only** a way to have an eye on **important** or **critical** informations that you don't want in the slides but than you need to talk about. This might be useful in numerous case:

- You're giving a course to student
- Good Slides Practices need that you don't write too many on slides
- You're testing your application like me ...
- You're having memory loss
- There's already too many informations on your slides
- And so on ...
